



## Cookie Policy (Effective 01.07.2020)

1. What is a cookie?
  - a. Wikipedia's explanation:
    - i. A cookie, also known as an HTTP cookie, web cookie, or browser cookie, is usually a small piece of data sent from a website and stored in a user's web browser while a user is browsing a website. When the user browses the same website in the future, the data stored in the cookie can be retrieved by the website to notify the website of the user's previous activity. Cookies were designed to be a reliable mechanism for websites to remember the state of the website or activity the user had taken in the past. This can include clicking particular buttons, logging in, or a record of which pages were visited by the user even months or years ago.

5. The Cookie we use are:
  - a. Session and Token:
    - i. Session - If the website requires a login then this cookie will be stored, temporarily.
    - ii. Token - This cookie allows you to return to the site and shop without logging in, the secure checkout will still require a login. It is kept for 120 days. But is refreshed when you return to the site and the normal session has expired.
